A Lecturer is a ten-month, full-time employee who teaches 30 credits per academic year and provides student and learning support services during the assigned periods. The Lecturer holds a strong commitment to teaching; maintains office and advising hours for students; actively participates in the university community; and does related work as required. This is a non-tenure track position that may be renewed on an annual basis. Teaching assignments and related responsibilities may include day, evening, weekend and online courses. Courses may be taught at the Union campus and/or the Ocean County College campus in Toms River, New Jersey or other locations as indicated below. Positions are effective September 1, 2013.

The School of General Studies provides students with broad preparation for their majors and for life's social and intellectual challenges. The skills developed and the knowledge acquired through general education coursework will support achievement in the major and success in endeavors beyond graduation. Two positions are available to teach **Developmental and General Education Math** courses and one position is available to teach **Research & Technology** courses. Research & Technology is a 2000-level course that is part of the writing across the curriculum program.

Qualifications: Master's degree in math and/or math education required for the math positions. Master's degree in a related field required for the Research & Technology position. A minimum of one year of teaching experience at the post-secondary level is also required for all positions. Interest or experience in using advanced and innovative instructional technologies to improve the teaching/learning process is highly desirable.
